## POSITION OVERVIEW

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Each respective **CLASS PRESIDENT OF THE ASSOCIATED STUDENT COUNCIL (ASC)** serves as a primary representative of their class to the various facets of the University and the community at large. As such, each Class President should be engaged with their class in order to address student concerns and provide opportunities to build a vibrant class and campus community. The Class President will assist in accomplishing the goals and objectives set forth by the Department of Student Development and the Associated Student Council.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

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1. Be enrolled as a full-time undergraduate ONU student
2. Maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA
3. Profess Jesus Christ as Lord and be committed to living a consistent life of Christian witness on and off campus, representing Christ and Olivet
4. Be in good standing with the Department of Student Development and the Associated Student Council

## FOCUSED EFFORTS

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- Class representation
- Engage with efforts that aide in student satisfaction and retention—this includes, but is not limited to, helping to host all-school events and coordinating class level initiatives

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- Serve as a liaison between classmates, ASC student body president, and Student Development personnel by providing an open dialog for discussion, making recommendations, and providing potential solutions

- Coordinate and manage class communications
- Be aware of campus events and news in order to cross promote and encourage student engagement
- Take responsibility to initiate and lead class council's group care and meetings

### COMPENSATION

### NOTATIONS

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This position and its responsibilities will provide mentoring, practical training, and public awareness.

Class Council Members are required to attend all school and class events, in addition to Tuesday's council meetings. Should scheduling conflicts arise the Student Body President will be required to replace a president who is no longer able to keep ASC commitments.
